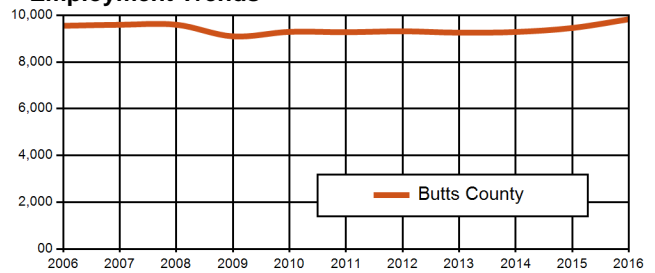

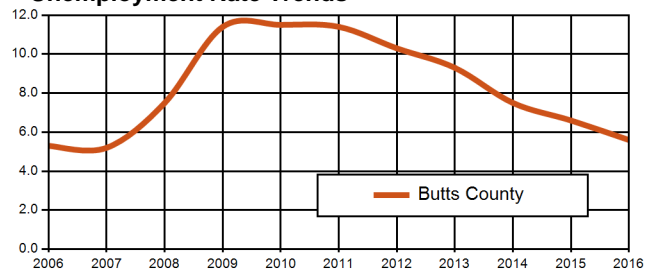

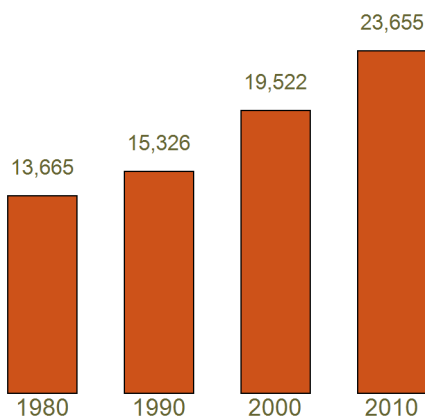
Employment Trends

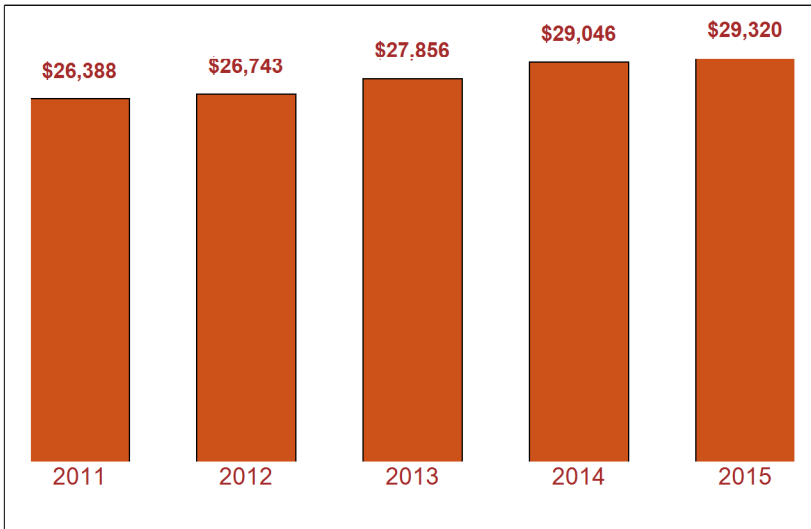

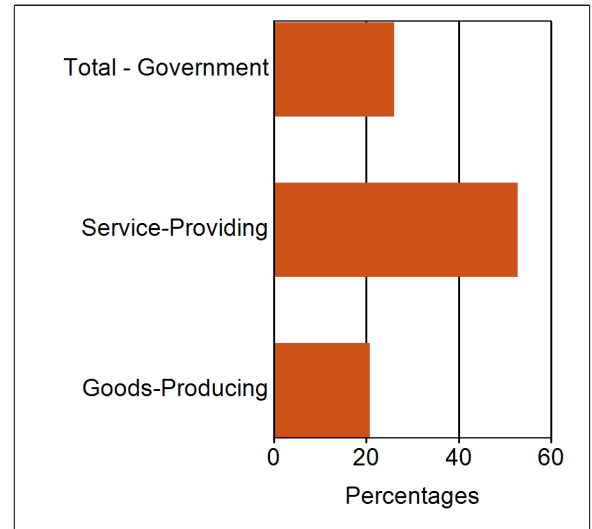
## Butts Per Capita Income
